



### Sport Premium Report

From September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision. Within the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust we aim to provide high quality sport. At St Andrew's CE Primary School, over a number of years, we have provided the following:

- *Provision of after-school clubs*
- *The upgrade and improvement of a range and quality of PE resources*
- *CPD opportunities for staff engaged in delivering high quality PE in school sport*
- *Supply cover for staff attending sporting events*
- *Specialist coaches to teach sport in school*

### Impact Report for Last Year 2023 – 24

Our Sport Premium Funding for the last academic year was: **£16 000**. This money was used as follows and impacted as detailed below.

Hire of professional sports teachers for lunchtime and after school clubs – PH Sports.	4300.00	Sports coaches delivered high quality clubs including multi skills, gymnastics, dodgeball, athletics, rounders and cricket in both key stages. Free clubs ensured equality of opportunity. They supported children at lunchtime to engage in meaningful sports activities which also led to better behaviour.
Hire of professional sports teachers during curriculum time including day workshops – Ryan Bissett (tennis and multi skills) and Carly Reader (dance).	4100.00	Children and teachers have had a year of high quality specialist coaching merged into their curriculum.
KS2 Outdoor Education	225.00	Year 5 children were able to attend 'Sail for a fiver' learning how to sail and enhance team building skills.
Upgrading sports equipment including sports kits and sports leader resources	2400.00	PE equipment is fit for purpose and safe to use leading to better engagement and higher outcomes in lessons.
PE Leader release time	500.00	PE Leader's release time has allowed her to co-ordinate the subject including time spent on researching and purchasing equipment, implementing the PE curriculum, arranging clubs throughout the year, organising Bikeability training in the Autumn term, swimming for Years 5 and 6 in the Spring term as well as two successful sports days in the Summer term.
Hoodies for staff teaching PE	540	Adults wearing school staff PE uniform help to raise the profile of PE.
Purchase of new football goals and netball posts.	1500	New football goals and netball posts enhanced the children's performance, success, enjoyment and safety in lessons and after-school clubs.

Our Sport Premium Funding for the current academic year is: **£18 080**. The following plan details how we plan to use the money to maintain and improve provision.

Top up swim lessons for Year 6	2400.00	Children will meet end of KS2 NC requirements of swimming 25m+ competently and completing water safety lessons.
Hire of professional sports teachers for lunch and after school clubs – liaise with Weymouth Football Club	3500.00	Sports coaches will deliver high quality clubs. Children will have access to more physical activity. Free clubs will ensure equality of opportunity. Sports coaches will support children at lunchtime to engage in meaningful sports activities and develop sport specific skills.
Hire of professional sports teachers during curriculum time including day workshops	3375.00	We are planning to continue working with local sports coaches to offer high quality teaching and CPD opportunities for staff to increase sports participation.
KS2 Outdoor Education/Life-saving skills	500.00	Children will experience new adventurous activities developing personal and interpersonal skills.
Transport to sporting events and supply cover for staff to attend.	600.00	All pupils will have the opportunity to enjoy sport and gain a sense of achievement. Equality in opportunity: no pupil excluded due to transport issues.
Upgrading sports equipment including sports kits and sports leader resources	2555.00	Children will have a positive experience of physical activity and will encourage them to keep as active as possible during lessons and playtimes.
Healthy Lifestyles Plan Include reintroduction of daily mile/walk and talk, healthy school status, activity weeks, promoting healthy lifestyle with families, PE leader to meet with Weymouth Football Club and DHT MHST to work with children on mental health.	2250.00	All pupils to have the opportunity to live a healthy lifestyle in order for them to flourish in all aspects of their lives.
Purchase of new sports tops and jackets for staff	1200	School staff wearing PE uniform help to raise the profile of PE and are quickly identifiable.
PE Leader release time – 42 hours	1500.00	We hope to enter as many competitions and events as possible this year. PE Leads to have time to complete admin tasks and attend meetings enabling St Andrew's to take part. Time will also be spent monitoring and supporting staff to ensure we have a broad and balanced curriculum with assessment opportunities included.
Purchase of visualisers	200.00	New visualisers will enable children to look closely at items of PE equipment and for teachers to model their use. Teachers will be able to sketch out ideas for an activity such as a race or a team game.
