

Sport Premium Report

From September 2013, all schools have been provided with funding to support the Olympic legacy and to enable the delivery of effective sports provision. Within the Diocese of Salisbury Academy Trust, we aim to provide high quality sport. At St Andrew's CE Primary School, over a number of years, we have provided the following:

- *Provision of after-school clubs*
- *The upgrade and improvement of a range and quality of PE resources*
- *Provision of new playtime equipment*
- *CPD opportunities for staff engaged in delivering high quality PE in school sport*
- *Provide supply cover for staff attending sporting events*
- *Provide specialist coaches to teach sport in school*
- *Provide enrichment opportunities for all pupils*
- *Provide extra – curricular clubs and activities.*

Impact Report for Last Year 2022 – 23

Our Sport Premium Funding for the last academic year was: **£17,090**. There was also an under spend from 2021/22 leading to a total of **£26,320**. This money was used as follows and impacted as detailed below.

Maintenance of playground equipment	1850.00	To ensure that all equipment is fit for purpose.

Transport to sporting events and supply cover for staff to attend.	940.00	Supply cover and transport to and from was Bronze Ambassador training in Beaminster (October 2022) was arranged.

PE Leader release time	667.00	PE Leader's release time has allowed her to co-ordinate the subject including time spent on researching and purchasing equipment, implementing the PE curriculum, arranging all clubs throughout the year, organising Bikeability training in the Autumn term, swimming for Years 5 and 6 in the Spring term, windsurfing for Year 5 as well as two successful sports days in the summer term.
Hire of professional sports teachers during curriculum time including day workshops.	5666.00	In the summer term, dance instructor Carly Reader, spent 4 days at St Andrew's delivering workshops across the school from N1 and N2 (EYFS) to Year 6. This gave children a taste of professional and expert tuition as well as enhancing their flexibility and co-ordination.
Subsidising Outdoor Education Days	750.00	Year 5 children had the opportunity to try windsurfing at the National Sailing Academy.
CPD for staff	515.00	Cricket coaching was arranged for a staff meeting. Time was given to teachers to look through the online GetSet4PE training.

Monitoring and Evaluation

- Staff feedback from training and events will indicate levels of increased confidence and skills at teaching aspects of PE.
